CLASS PARENTS' INFORMATION MEETINGS



A reminder that we will be holding parents class information meetings to discuss class routines, homework, PE timetables etc. starting next week. All meetings start at **3.40pm** and will be held in your child's classroom. These meetings are for parents only - your child will be able to wait in the school library (with the exception of class F children who will stay with their parents) - they must however **remain in the library and not wander around school** while the meetings are being held. READING EVENING - CLASS F

There will be a reading evening on Tuesday 12th September at 7pm in the School Hall for all our reception children's parents. It is very important that at least one representative for each child is able to attend this meeting.

This meeting will be about how your child learns to read, what activities and resources we use in the teaching of reading, and what you can do to help them at home, both to get ready for reading and once they start to bring home words and books. We look forward to seeing you there.

CHILD PICK-UP PROCEDURES



We would like to remind parents and also make new parents aware that if someone else is picking up your child on a regular basis i.e. child-minder, friend, relative etc. that you must inform school in writing who this will be. This will avoid any problems that teachers may face when releasing the children at the end of the day. Please note even if your pick up arrangements haven't changed from last year we still need written confirmation for this academic year. This is also the case for any pupils who walk to and from school unaccompanied by an adult; for safeguarding issues please can you advise school in writing. If your child is going to be collected by someone else on a

one-off basis please ensure you advise the office by 3.00pm on the day in question. Many thanks for your co-operation.

MORNING PROCEDURES

We would like to remind parents not to come into children's cloakrooms or try to catch the teacher with messages first thing in the morning as this can make it difficult for the teacher to start the day promptly and in a calm orderly way. Messages can be left for the teachers via the office or if you can catch the class teacher at the end of the school day. Many thanks for your co-operation.

CONTACT DETAILS

We would also like to take this opportunity to ask all our parents/carers to advise school of any changes to contact numbers and addresses. It is important that school holds **accurate information** in this area should we need to contact you during school hours. CAR PARK SAFETY



We would like to take this opportunity to remind our parents that when dropping and collecting children that they ensure they access the school via the left gate during these times and refrain from crossing the car park. Could we also ask that you advise anyone who may bring or collect children to school on your behalf of this procedure. This is important for the safety of all our staff, parents and children.

SCHOOL DINNERS



School Dinner Money for children in Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 should be paid in advance half termly. As there are 8 weeks to this half term (minus 1 day), the amount due is calculated at £2.55 per day, £12.75 per week; £99.45 for the term. Any credits from the Summer Term will be deducted. Payments are to be made online via SchoolMoney where you have the option to part pay or pay in full. Bills are calculated for the half-term and adjustments for any dinners not taken due to trips or illness will be made the following half-term. Payments for this half-term will be available on-line from next week. Miss Stubbs will be

happy to advise on any queries you may have and is in school on Mondays and Wednesdays.

A reminder also that should you wish to move from school dinners to packed lunches or vice versa please can you give at least **one week's** notice, in writing.

TINS ON TUESDAY

Tins on Tuesday is organised by the School Council, and on the 1st Tuesday of every month 2 classes bring in tinned items for our green tub which is in the foyer (other non-tinned donations can be dropped off at any time). These items then get delivered to the Wetherby Food Bank.



Slightly delayed this month, it will be the turn of **Class F & Class 1** next Tuesday, 12th September to donate to this worthy cause. Many thanks, to all the children, staff and parents who continue to support the food bank.

Suggested items this month are: tinned meat meals, such as stew, mince, chilli. Tinned ham, corned beef, hot dogs, meatballs. Tinned items such as: soups, fruit, veg, rice pudding, custard. Long-Life puddings. Chocolate & sweet snacks, and deodorant.

Class 3 will be starting their swimming lessons on a Thursday afternoon from 14th September. A separate letter has gone out to Class 3 this week.


LARGE RUCKSACKS
